

Professor Sunil Maharaj, Vice-Principal: Research, Innovation and Postgraduate Education and Professor Vasu Reddy, Dean of the Faculty of Humanities cordially invites you to the launch of the book *Foucault and Governmentality. Living to Work in the Age of Control* by Professor Benda Hofmeyr, Department of Philosophy, University of Pretoria.

The launch seeks to provide some insight into and elicit discussion about the arguments developed in *Foucault and Governmentality*. *Living to Work in the Age of Control* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2022). The book seeks a critical understanding of what we are today in relation to our present, understood as the globalising neoliberal governmentality in which life is reduced to constant work under conditions of stealth control. The focus falls on knowledge workers subject to mechanisms of control and constant surveillance in neoliberal networked societies. To understand the way in which we are governed by mechanisms of control, Hofmeyr draws on Foucault's analyses of neoliberal governmentality in his Collége de France lectures of the late 70s. By drawing on the ancient notion of thumos, she furthermore explores the 'culture', 'ethos' or 'spiritedness' of work under and in relation to conditions of control that serve to incite knowledge workers willingly to work all the time. It would appear that neoliberal economic theory has found a way to tap into this gratifying psychic spiritedness to generate the present competitive entrepreneurial spirit, which is the very fuel that sustains neoliberal politico-economic expansion.

**Benda Hofmeyr** is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Pretoria. Her research interests fall within the broad ambit of contemporary Continental philosophy (especially thinkers following in the wake of Martin Heidegger with emphasis on post-structuralism and phenomenology) with an enduring ethico-political awareness and critical responsiveness to the demands of the present. She also has a keen interest in the entanglement of European and non-Western, especially post-colonial African philosophy and the possibility of a dialogue across these divergent yet fundamentally intertwined traditions of thought.
